

Poetry and Verse

Venue: Lutheran Centre, 21 Adelaide Rd, Victor Harbor

Monthly - starts Friday 13 August at 2pm

This is a group of a dozen or so members who meet to read, discuss, argue and generally just talk about poems, poets and poetry from the oldest to the very recent. Readings are sent out before each meeting and these serve as a basis for our discussions.

Words Plus

Venue: Uniting Church, Collingwood St, Goolwa

Fortnightly - starts Wednesday 11 August at 1.30pm

The group meets on the second and fourth Wednesdays for logophiles, epistomophiles, cruciverbalists and addicts of the obscure and/or appealing words and phrases in our English language, or any other. Beware, you may leave with onomatomania!

Opera and Ballet

Venue: Signal Point Theatrette, The Wharf, Goolwa

Monthly - starts Wednesday 14 July at 1pm

Our program includes a range of classic operas and ballets, and some more recent productions. Screenings are introduced by the coordinator who covers history of the plot, performance and the composer.

Classical Concerts

Play Reading Group
